For safety reasons we insist that all Scouts have the equipment listed in this kit list. Please remember keep the overall weight down, do not pack unnecessary kit or other items

It is essential to pack all spare clothes and sleeping bag into sealable plastic bags or dry bags to keep them dry.

1 pair of walking boots (broken in)	Boots are required to both keep feet dry and to help protect against sprained ankles etc. Can be worn to and from camp and not packed in bag.		
2 pairs of walking socks	One to wear, one for spare You must have proper hiking socks NOT sports socks or you will get blisters.		
Jacket/coat (waterproof and windproof)			
Waterproof over-trousers			
2 fleece tops or similar	One to wear whilst walking and one as a spare. Nothing bulky.		
2-3 t-shirts (thermal or activewear)			
2 walking trousers (warm, NOT jeans)			
1 pair shorts (if appropriate)

Flip flops/sandals (optional for camp site use)			
Warm hat and/or sunhat (as appropriate)

Rucksack	Expedition rucksacks are generally 65 – 70 litres to enable participants to pack all required expedition equipment.		
Rucksack liner (or 2 strong plastic bags)			
Sleeping bag	Must ft inside rucksack. Place in dry bag or plastic bag to keep dry. Should be a 3-season bag.		
Sleeping Bed Roll	Ideally small enough to be placed in rucksack.
